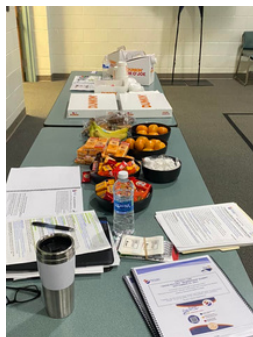
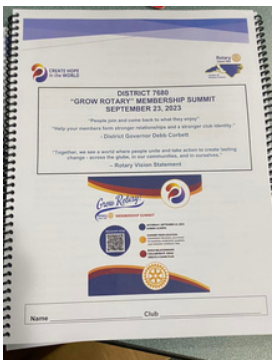
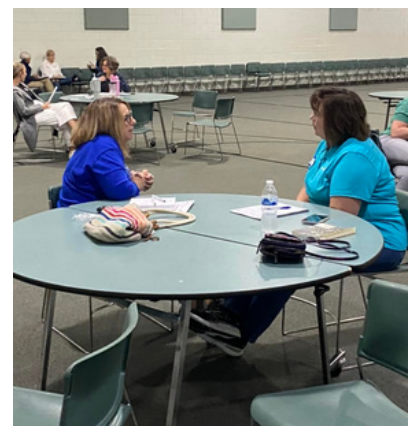
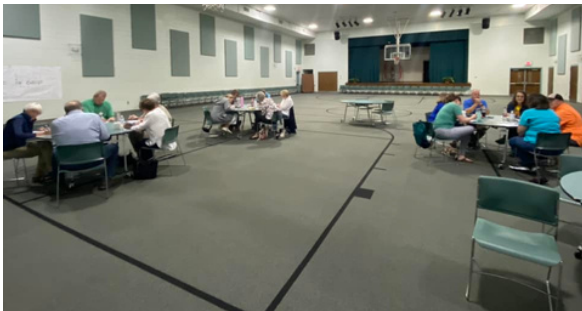
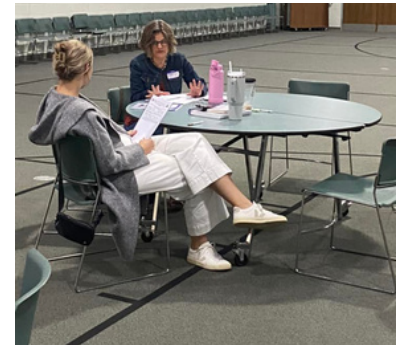


Membership Training - 9/23/2023
