



Amy Hopkins The Rotary Learning Center



Amy Hopkins is the Curriculum Development Supervisor for Rotary International, working to provide quality online courses and learning materials for Rotary members around the world. A second-generation Rotarian, Amy is member of the Rotary Club of Chicago Lakeview. She has served in numerous club and district roles, including club president and district learning facilitator for District 6450. She is a member of the Paul Harris Society and is a Paul Harris Fellow +3.

Originally from Joliet, Illinois, Amy is a graduate of the University of Iowa and National Louis University. Her career began in elementary education, serving as teacher, instructional coach, assistant principal, and principal over the years. In 2022, she combined her passions for adult learning and the service of Rotary by joining the Learning & Development staff. She lives in Chicago with her partner Brian (also a member of the Chicago Lakeview club) and their very spoiled dog.



Rotary has designated October as Economic and Community Development Month. During this month, Rotary members focus on growing local economies. They use their vocations to support the economy and their communities.

Rotary's work begins in the community. They support investments in people to create lasting economic improvement. For example, in Afghanistan, Rotary members opened a girls' school to break the cycle of poverty.

Last Week's Meeting

We had an engaging Club Assembly today, led by President Darrell Bonapart! We were visited by the recipient of our fifth annual W.A. Kennedy First Responder Scholarship, Giorgia Marcucci. Giorgia is a senior at UNC Charlotte and is majoring in Criminal Justice and Spanish. She already speaks Italian fluently and is fluent in Spanish as well. This scholarship is awarded to a student at UNCC majoring in a first responder field and is named in honor of Woodford Kennedy, one of our Charlotte Dilworth Rotary Club's founding members and first president of our club when it was established in 1948.

Kennedy was a fierce advocate for four-year colleges and in 1948, Charlotte did not yet have one. Kennedy knew that for Charlotte to thrive, it had to have a university. He lobbied legislators in Raleigh for years, finally succeeding in getting Charlotte College designated a four-year university, to be known as the University of North Carolina Charlotte. It was a joy to meet Giorgia!

In addition, we inducted two new members into our Charlotte Queen City Impact Club. Holly Or and Tina McKinney were welcomed with open arms and a warm Rotary embrace!



ANSWER Scholarship Festival - 9/30/2023

Saturday was simply incredibly special and rewarding. Last year, as part of a Rotary District grant we received, our club partnered with ANSWER Scholarship to provide support to their scholars. ANSWER provides opportunities for working Moms with children to attend college. These are women who likely would not be able to attend college but for the help and support of organizations like ANSWER that provide financial assistance. But beyond that, a critical part of ANSWER's success is the one-on-one mentoring they provide to their scholars. The mentors, all women, develop a bond with the scholars and help to ensure the support they need is in place. It also why more than 90% of students supported by ANSWER, successfully earn college degrees.

ANSWER held their annual ANSWER Scholarship Fall Festival Fundraiser today and our club showed up to volunteer our time and support to this incredible nonprofit. We had several members from our regular club and even our newest member who was initiated last week into our Impact club there with her son. We sold raffle tickets, popcorn, and cotton candy, hosted kids' games, and helped in other activities as needed. And we met an incredible young woman who personified what ANSWER is all about.

This woman was a scholar-student just a few years ago and successfully completed her undergraduate degree requirements. She didn't stop there, however. She has gone on to become a research scientist in the field of DNA sequencing and engineering in the area of AIDS and Alzheimer's research and is nearing completion of her Ph.D. in her specialty. And today, she serves as one of those valuable mentors for other student scholars. It's a remarkable example of what can happen when we invest in people.




