


Last Week's Meeting - Cristina Capello

Our Charlotte Dilworth Rotary Club was fortunate to hear a different kind of Veteran's Day story last week in honor and appreciation of all of our country's military including the Reserves and the Guard. The presentation was made by fellow Rotarian and 29-year veteran Cristina Tisa Capello of the Waxhaw-Weddington Club. Both Christina and her husband have served and her assignments have included two deployments with Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation New Dawn. Christine shared with us how much our men and women in the Guard and Reserves have to endure in the form of challenges like diminishing health care coverage and inadequate resilience training to better cope with PTSD.

We know it can be challenging to hear this phrase but we would be remiss if we didn't collectively say, thank-you for your service.
