I met a few other Rotarians from our Charlotte Queen City Impact Club for a volunteer shift at the Charlotte Community ToolBank building shelves. Potential Sedgefield Middle School Interact Club





Kevin and Jenny met virtually with Dr. Eric Tornfelt, Assistant Principal at Sedgefield Middle School on Wednesday, August 2, 2023, to discuss creating an Interact Club.

Dr. Tornfelt was provided with an overview of Rotary in general and how Interact clubs work within Rotary. He advised they are running their clubs in a different way this year. The students will participate in one club for three weeks and then move on to another club. This will help expose them to more ideas.

The school also has two ongoing groups: The Men of Sedgefield and the Dottie Rose Club.

The Men of Sedgefield is for the boys in the school. They have speakers come in and talk about their careers and urge students to perform acts of service.

The Dottie Rose Club is for the girls in the school. They are given the opportunity to "intern" at a technical job for a day for opportunities to learn about technical jobs they can aim to do.

We discussed different ways that Rotary can be involved. Moving forward, we believe the best action for now is to have Kevin and/or Darrell speak at one of the Men of Sedgefield meetings about their careers and why they volunteer. Kevin will set up a service project for approximately 20 kids in early December at the Diaper Bank. The school has received a CMS Foundation grant that can cover transportation for the kids.

After the first semester, if there is enough interest, we may discuss creating an Interact Club. Or if this works well, we may continue to do just service projects with the kids. Any Rotarian who wants to work with the kids will have to be vetted with our Youth Protection Awareness Training and fill out the CMS Volunteer request.

Sedgefield also needs Book Buddies, Lunch Buddies, and volunteers to simply greet the students in the morning. Each of these volunteer opportunities is only a 30-45 minute commitment. Signups will be coming when school is once again in session.

We are to send an email to Catherine at the end of August inquiring about dates for a speaking opportunity and a service project date.

Dr. Tornfelt was excited at the prospect of working with our club in the near future and longer term. We are supportive of the incremental steps in taken to assess the potential for creating an Interact Club but looking forward to continuing our ongoing partnership with Sedgefield.
