2. Rotary 101 will be a Zoom event in both October and November.


**We still have 10 slots at the Rotary Foundation dinner that you can sign up for and get reimbursed \$50.** These dinners are fun and a great time to socialize!

John G. Clarkson, M.D., is a nationally distinguished practitioner, researcher, and educator with a celebrated career in ophthalmology spanning more than 40 years. He is the former Executive Director and CEO of the American Board of Ophthalmology and is Dean Emeritus and Professor of Ophthalmology at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine in Miami, FL.

Under Dr. Clarkson's leadership, the American Board of Ophthalmology independently certified the knowledge, skills, and expertise of approximately 500 new eye physicians each year and grew to more than 16,000 active diplomates in the United States and abroad.

Dr. Clarkson currently serves as Executive Director of the Ophthalmology Research Foundation and volunteers at the CPCC Eye Clinic, formerly the Lions Eye Clinic, in Charlotte for indigent patients seeking eye care.

Dr. Clarkson is a volunteer with MeckMIN with a particular interest in alleviating gun violence in our communities.


**Polio Update

# Five Reasons You Should Bring Your Own Bags



(Keep them in your car, it's not that hard.)

- 1. Save the animals and the environment.** Have you ever thought about how long it takes for a plastic bag to decompose? Depending on the environment, it can take 1,000 years or more for a bag to break down! It's been estimated that one million birds and over 100,000 sea mammals worldwide are injured or die when they mistake plastic for food or become entangled. Using your own bags means that fewer plastic bags will end up in a landfill and are less harmful to wildlife.
- 2. Save your money!** Some grocery stores offer a discount when you bring a reusable bag. When at the checkout, ask your cashier if the store offers bag discounts. It's typically five cents per bag, but that adds up! Every little bit helps when you're on a budget!
- 3. Engage in activism.** Your voice matters. By purchasing a tote bag with a message, you can easily become a walking billboard for a good cause. You can also search for brands that make custom reusable grocery bags in a wide variety of styles and prints. Don't want to buy reusable bags? Get creative! There are cool ways to make grocery shopping less routine and a bit more fun!
- 4. Say no to more clutter.** You don't realize just how many bags have piled underneath the sink until they've taken over. Create more space and storage areas by decluttering your cupboards.
- 5. Create an efficient grocery trip.** Cloth bags are far more likely to be sturdier and less likely to collapse on you from the grocery store to your home. Having a full bag cave in on you at the parking lot is NOT fun!

There are countless other reasons why we should all say **NO TO PLASTIC BAGS**, like their release of toxic particles, the use of energy, etc. We hope these 5 reasons will be a good start to taking action, even starting small will make a great impact! Spread the word!

### 5 REASONS WHY WE MUST ERADICATE POLIO

#### 1 TO IMPROVE LIVES.

Today, 19 million people who would otherwise be paralyzed by polio are walking, and 1.5 million people who would otherwise have died are alive.

#### 2 TO INVEST IN THE FUTURE.

If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year. A polio-free world will be a healthier world for children everywhere.

#### 3 TO IMPROVE CHILD HEALTH.

Polio surveillance networks and vaccination campaigns also monitor children for other health problems, like vitamin deficiency and measles, so we can address them sooner.

#### 4 TO LOWER HEALTH CARE COSTS.

The global effort to eradicate polio has already saved more than \$27 billion in health care costs since 1988, and expects to save \$14 billion more by 2050.

#### 5 TO MAKE HISTORY.

Polio eradication will be one of history's greatest public health achievements, with polio following smallpox to become only the second human disease eradicated from the world.




## OUR MISSION

The mission of Honor Flight is to transport America's veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit the memorials dedicated to honoring those who have served and sacrificed for our country.


## THE HONOR FLIGHT NETWORK
