



As a young adult with big dreams, this scholarship is a small step toward the finish line. I am originally from Naples, Italy, and moved to the United States with nothing but hope for a bright successful future. I left Italy because it lacked many resources and opportunities for us students, and this scholarship is proof that I am finally on the right track. Everything my parents sacrificed was done for me and my future, and this scholarship is a way of rewarding them and their hard work.

I chose to pursue a degree in Criminal Justice because, as I am able to speak three languages, I believe I could find comfort in the federal international side. I am pursuing a major in Criminal Justice and Spanish with a minor in Italian, and I am obtaining a certification in translation from English-Spanish and Spanish-English as well. I am the president of the Italian Club at The University of North Carolina at Charlotte, and I am also a member of the Phi Beta Kappa Honor Society, as well as Alpha Phi Sigma – Omega Theta, which is the Criminal Justice Honor Society here at Charlotte. I am also pursuing an internship with the U.S. Marshal Service located in Charlotte. This scholarship will help me tremendously for the present and future as well.

While I only have one year left to obtain my Bachelor's degree, I hope I can continue to be useful to my peers and professors as well, as I am also pursuing an internship as a teacher assistant. 
